It seems like summer was never going to arrive. The cool, rainy Spring went on far too long. It's nice to finally get some hot, sunny days so we can enjoy the outdoors.



## Thousand Islands Two Castle Tour

Two castles but no Game of Thrones! On June 22, eleven members of the Ottawa Section had a great day enjoying a boat tour and visiting two historic castles located in the Thousand Islands region of the St Lawrence River.

We met at Rockport around 9:00 which meant an early start for most of us! At 10:00 we boarded the Sea Prince II and headed out under sunny skies and calm winds for Boldt Castle.



Both castles are located on the US side of the river so passports were required for this international event. The story of Boldt Castle is one of romance and tragedy. The castle was built by George C. Boldt, who became a multi-millionaire in the late 1800's through his involvement in the hotel business including the famous Waldorf Astoria.

In 1900 George Bodlt decided to build a castle as a gift to his beloved




wife Louise. At one point Mr. Boldt owned as many as 64 islands in the Thousand Island region. The castle was to be built on Heart Island. The "heart" theme is prevalent throughout the castle and shows the deep love George had for Louise.

Three hundred craftsmen, including stonemasons, carpenters and artists fashioned the six story, 120 room castle along with its extensive



gardens, power house and a tower, (complete with two bowling alleys) as a playhouse for their children. No expense or detail was spared.



Four years after construction of the castle had started, tragedy struck when Louise died at the age of 42 in 1904. The heartbroken George, immediately sent a telegram to cease all work on the castle.

Boldt never returned to Heart Island, leaving behind the structure as a monument of his love for his wife.



For 73 years the castle was left to the mercy of the rain, wind and snow. Vandals caused significant damage and the walls were covered in graffiti. Thankfully in 1977 the Thousand Islands Bridge Authority acquired the property and decided to restore the castle to preserve it for future generations to enjoy. The restorations done to date are amazing and give a sense of what the castle would have been like in its prime.

Once we cleared US Customs, we had about 1.5 hours to explore this magnificent structure and its grounds.



We noted that the water levels in the St Lawrence are still quite high necessitating the construction of raised platforms over the normal docking areas as they were underwater!

When we re-boarded the Sea Prince, they had laid out our lunch which we enjoyed as we sailed through Millionaire's Row, home to many of the rich and famous Americans at the turn of the century. We then turned back and headed to our next stop—Singer Castle.



Singer Castle is much less known than Boldt Castle and located about 45 minutes down river from Boldt Castle. We enjoyed the ride taking in the scenery and watching the expensive yachts sail by. Singer Castle, located on Dark Island, is the only remaining castle on the St Lawrence to be completed, fully



furnished and resided in, during the heyday of the great builders and industrialists. The castle was built by Fredrick Bourne, starting in 1902 and completed in 1905. Fredrick Bourne was the fifth president of the Singer Sewing Machine Company, hence the



name of the castle. Originally built as a hunting lodge, the castle has a medieval theme and is quite different in its style and finishings from Boldt Castle. Similar to Boldt Castle, Fredrick Bourne built the castle as a surprise for his wife Emma and their children. The castle is built from granite, has 4 stories and 28 rooms. The castle also has a boat house and power station. There are several mysteries, including the numerous hidden passages throughout. It also includes a dungeon in one of the towers.

One interesting fact is that 2000 loads of topsoil were brought from Canada to

cover the eighty-seven acres of rock on the island. So although we were in the US we were walking on Canadian soil!

Singer Castle is now owned by a European Consortium who collect castles—quite a hobby! We had a guided tour of the castle by a very knowledgeable young man. While it is good they are trying to keep the castle with its original furnishings, we found that the current owners are not putting in the necessary funds to preserve the items and there was a general lack of maintenance in the castle. After our tour we again boarded the boat and headed back to Rockport, arriving around 4PM.



We all had a great time on this event. Thanks to Bob Graham for suggesting it and to Uwe Rutenburg for his assistance and the info he provided.
